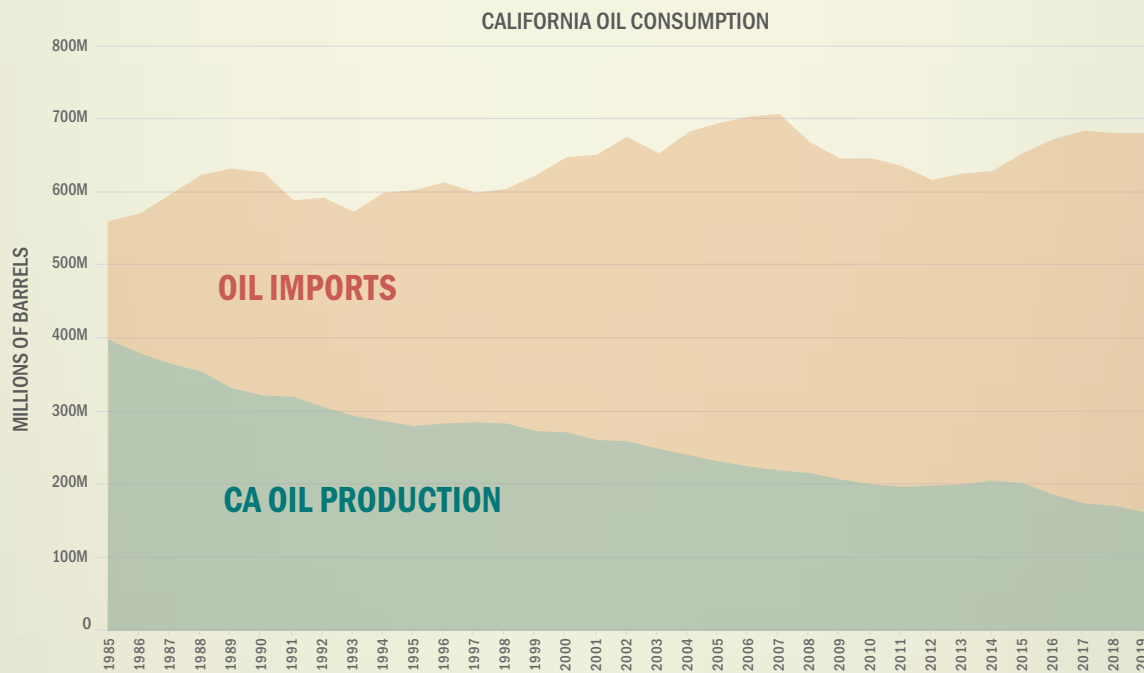

California's **OIL DEMAND** DRAMATICALLY EXCEEDS its in-state supply.

While the state's oil consumption has **INCREASED** over the past three decades, state policies have strongly favored oil imports over in-state production making Californians dependent on foreign producers like Saudi Arabia and Iraq that do not share the Golden State's leading safety, labor, human rights and environmental standards.



WE COULD BE PRODUCING MORE ENERGY HERE

California currently produces 25% of the oil used within the state and imports the rest from foreign countries. The state could easily produce as much as 50% - making us less dependent on unstable foreign countries that expose us to political and price volatility. **According to a recent poll*, nearly 60% of California voters support legislation that restricts oil and gas imports from foreign countries and encourages more in-state production.**
